Oct. 23 • Colonial Park



Little Free Library Unveiling

Colonial Park

West University will become the first city to install a Little Free Library since the movement began in 2009, to be unveiled during



the Full Moon Fest on Oct. 23 in Colonial Park. Designed to look like West University Elementary School (in honor of the school's 90th anniversary this year), the Colonial Park Little Free Library will be a free-standing structure where neighbors of all ages can "take a book, return a book" and help spread the love of reading. The project has been spearheaded by local author Chris Cander in partnership with the city's parks department.

"When I first presented the Parks and Recreation Department with the idea of a single library, their overwhelming enthusiasm resulted in a plan for a library in each of the city's six parks," Cander says. Each of the Little Free Libraries will be designed to look like West University landmarks.

The first library, which will be approximately 4' x 3', is being built by local builder Fortitude Studios and underwritten by Roger Martin Properties. Other Press and Bright Sky Press are donating books by their authors to establish the initial inventory. From there, residents are welcome to stop by the library and take a book, and encouraged to return it—as well as contribute others—when they're finished. Acting as library steward, Cander will periodically monitor the stock, but the inventory will be mostly self-sustaining through active community book sharing. The Parks and Recreation Department has committed to maintenance for this and future libraries. A custom bookplate stamp will be available to personalize the books that move through the library and remind readers that all Little Free Library books are "always a gift, never for sale."
